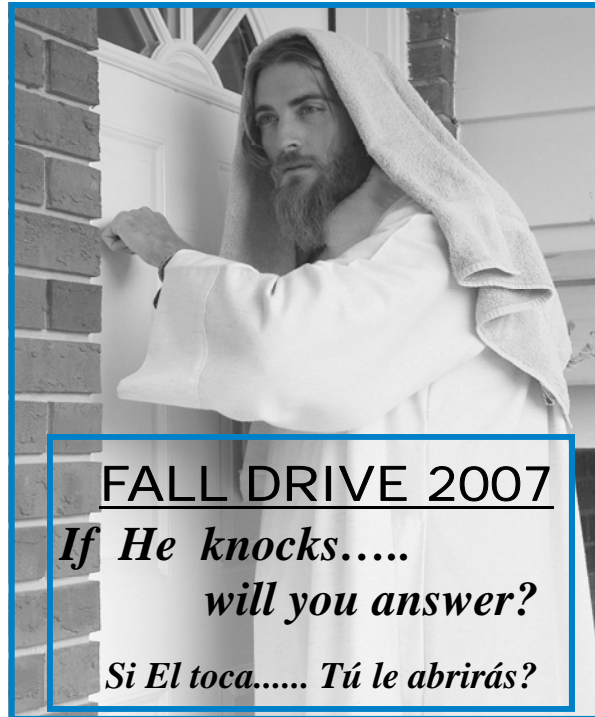
MISSION STATEMENT

Dear Sacred Heart Parish Family,

We, as one Body of Christ are beginning today our Fall Drive 2008. Fall Drive is our effort and sacrifice to reach out to many ministries in our parish, education, religious formation and worship in thanksgiving. We all have come a long way to see these amazing things happening in our parish because of your extraordinary generosity, sacrifice and a sense of "Our Home" love for Sacred Heart. I know as you know, we all live in an unprecedented poor economy in the nation and the world but we have received and continuously receive abundant blessings from God. ANOINTING OF THE SICK

"It's just for old people." "You can only receive it if you're really sick with something like cancer." "You get it right before you die."

If you think the Anointing of the Sick is just for the extremely old or the critically ill, or if you assume the only time you can receive it is at the moment of death, you aren't alone. Most Catholics still think of the Sacrament that same way. Although the sacrament began as a ritual of healing, over time the emphasis shifted to the forgiveness of sins on the deathbed, when such forgiveness would be the final preparation for heaven. The Vatican II Council returned the original meaning to the sacrament by emphasizing that it is not only for those who are at the point of death, but for anyone, regardless of age, can receive the Sacrament if his/her health is seriously impaired. It can also be administered before surgery and, contrary to many people's belief, it can be received more than once if the original illness gets worse or if another serious sickness is diagnosed.

Today we are all aware that tensions, fear and anxiety about the future affect not only our mind but our body as well. These illnesses can be serious. They can move us to ask for the healing touch of Christ in the Sacrament of Anointing. Persons with the disease of alcoholism or persons suffering from other addictions can be anointed. So can those who suffer from various mental disorders. The anxiety before exploratory surgery to determine if cancer is present is a situation in which Christ's power can be invoked in the sacrament.

In these cases the person does not have to wait until the illness is so grave that he or she is in the hospital or institutionalized to celebrate the sacrament. Sacraments, after all, are community celebrations. It is preferable to celebrate them in the context of family and parish even before going to the hospital. The sick person has a better opportunity to appreciate the prayers and symbols of the rite when in her or his customary community.

Therefore, I invite all parishioners to bring members of your family, friends, relatives and neighbors for the celebration of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the sick. It will be administered at the 6:00 PM Senior Appreciation Mass on OCTOBER 14th. Come, let us pray for all the sick.



“HOME SUPPORT FOR OUR TROOPS”

In an effort to show our support for our troops “in Harms Way” we are hoping our parishioners might remember them while out shopping, or just wanting to show them in some way our true appreciation for keeping safe.

These are some items they would enjoy from home, sorted into 6 categories, that soldiers do not have readily available to them.

TOILETRIES: Hand wipes, toothpaste and tooth brushes, mouth wash and breath strips, dental floss, shampoo (no-rinse and regular) skin lotion, sun block, chapstick, soap, shaving gel and deodorant (non-aerosol), disposable razors.

SPECIAL NEEDS: “Rain-X” anti-fog (for goggles from any dept., or auto store), sunglasses (any type), letters of “support”.

STATIONARY: Birthday, anniversary and thank you cards (unsigned), paper, pencils, pens, envelopes.

FOOD: Energy drinks (canned), Gatorade (or “Propel” packets, Kool-aid, Louisiana sauce, candy (bars and hard), peanuts (any type), sunflower and pumpkin seeds, gum, tic-tacs, Twinkies, Ding-Dongs, etc., potato and/or Corn chips, canned sardines, tuna, anchovies, Spaghettios, chicken and/or Ramen noodle soups, snack crackers, “slim-jims” or beef jerky, protein bars, coffee, creamer (powdered), sugar, “Equal” or “Sweet N Low” packets.

CLOTHES: White T-shirts, knee-cut socks

RECREATIONAL: Nerf footballs, playing cards, batteries (AA or AAA most requested), DVD’s & CD’s (used or new), playstation, X-Box games (used or new), books, word puzzles, travel games

In order to keep the \$3 per candle price, we have changed the type of vigil candles we are using. **The blue and red glass candle holders are the property of the church and are now permanently attached to the candles racks and cannot be removed.** A 5-day plastic insert will be used. **So please DO NOT REMOVE any vigil candles from the church.** Please light all candles in the church candle racks and do not remove them. 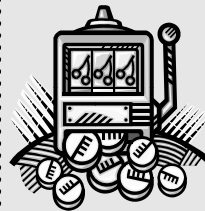

REFLEXION DOMINGO XXVIII

En esta parábola del banquete, el Rey (Dios) celebra las bodas de su hijo (Cristo) el cual merece ser llamado esposo de la humanidad, porque la ha reunido en un solo cuerpo para unirla a sí. Esta obra grandiosa de reunir a los hombres para luego resucitarlos, es la que se va realizando a lo largo de toda la historia. Cristo resucitado es el que dirige, el Espíritu de Dios es el que va transformando y resucitando a los hombres para que puedan sentarse a la mesa de los vivos.

Si la parábola del banquete proclamada hoy, es una comparación del Reino de Dios, podríamos decir entonces que en el Reino, Dios ofrece la salvación (el banquete) de manera generosa, gratuita, amorosa, incondicional; pero a pesar de esta gratuidad, la salvación puede ser rechazada por el hombre (como lo fue en tiempos de Jesús y lo sigue siendo hoy en día). Por eso lo primero que Jesús está pidiendo es una actitud de sencillez, humildad y disponibilidad para "recibir" la salvación y vivir en el Reino. Los primeros invitados se creían tan seguros o estaban tan ocupados, que no pensaban necesitar de esta salvación y por eso pierden su vida.

Pero además de esta apertura para recibir el amor de Dios, Jesús nos pide responsabilidad, es decir: saber responder con nuestras vidas a tan grande amor, con obras y no con palabras. Por que no se puede pertenecer al Reino y gozar de sus privilegios (ser hijo de Dios, saberse amado en todo momento, pertenecer a su Iglesia) sin vivir los compromisos que este Reino conlleva. Hay que aprender a traer el traje bien puesto como ciudadanos del Reino que somos.

Por último, la parábola nos invita a vivir una apertura hacia el hermano, pues no importa su condición social, moral, o económica... todos somos invitados a vivir la Alegría del Reino de Dios.

Así, podemos decir que para vivir plenamente como humanos y cristianos, Jesús nos pide ser: sencillos para sabernos necesitados de Dios, responsables para traer siempre nuestro "traje" puesto, y fraternos, reconociendo que cada persona es un "invitado" más al gran banquete del Reino.

INFORMACION GENERAL: Sigamos orando en casa para que Dios dé la Salud a nuestro Pastor Padre Víctor Miranda. Vamos también pensando ya en las celebraciones de fin de año: Día de muertos, Novena y fiesta de la Guadalupe, Posadas y Navidad.
