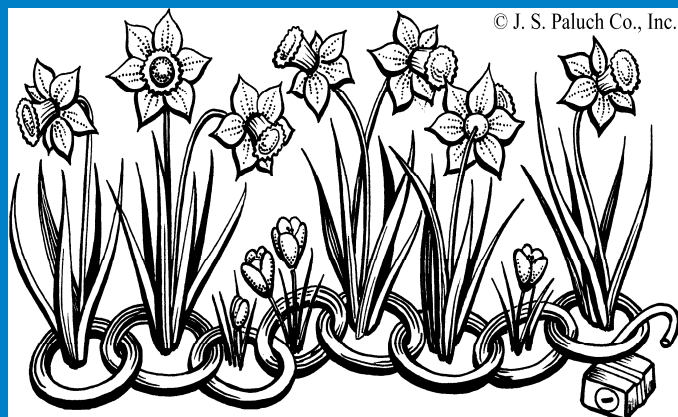

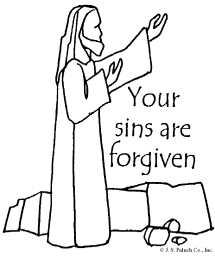

A MAGICIAN'S TRICK

When a magician performs her best magic trick she may say, "See, I am doing something new. This has never been done before!" The children in the audience may be astounded and gasp, "We have never seen anything like this!" Children believe their eyes and ears, but we adults know better. Before the trick is even over we start figuring out how the magician has deceived us.

Some of that spirit of disbelief can creep into our relationship with God, too. When we read in Isaiah, "See, I am doing something new . . . your sins I remember no more" (Isaiah 43:19, 25), we think it is too good to be true. When Jesus says to the paralyzed man and to us, "Child, your sins are forgiven . . . pick up your mat and walk" (Mark 2:5, 9), we may struggle to take him at his word. Like the cynical scribes, we adults may doubt that Jesus has enough power or mercy to forgive our sinfulness and empower us to change.

CHILD, YOUR SINS ARE FORGIVEN

Yet Paul reminds us that "the Son of God, Jesus Christ . . . was not 'yes' and 'no' " (2 Corinthians 1:19). Jesus Christ says "yes" to every sinner—even those we think are beyond the reach of his power or his mercy. When we humbly accept the gift of God's astonishing forgiveness we can find ourselves no longer paralyzed, but able to do what previously would have been impossible for us—to pick up our mats and walk. Then we are the ones who glorify God, saying, "We have never seen anything like this." When we respond "Amen" to God this is what we mean: that we accept in childlike faith the forgiveness we do not deserve, and welcome the new possibilities that God's mercy opens up for us.

Yes, Jesus' authority to forgive sins on earth extends even to us! Amen! Amen!

LENTEN OBLIGATIONS

FAST and ABSTINENCE:The code of Canon Law states that all Christ's faithful are obliged by the Lord's command, each in his or her own way to undertake that conversion of mind and heart called penance. In order that the faithful may join together in a common practice of penance, some days of penance are prescribed. On these days the faithful in a special way devote themselves to prayer, engage in works of piety and charity, and deny themselves by fulfilling their obligations more faithfully and especially be observing the fast and abstinence the Church prescribes. **DAYS OF FAST and ABSTINENCE:** Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. **DAYS OF ABSTINENCE:** ALL Fridays in Lent. **ABSTINENCE:** Means NOT eating meat, and binds Catholics 14 years of age and older. **FAST:** Means LIMITING oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals each day and binds Catholics from their 18th to 59th birthdays. One is not bound to fast if health or the ability to work is affected. **PRAYER** Please try to devote as much time to prayer and reflection as possible. Our Fridays with Stations and Mass in Church at 7:00pm is a good way to help achieve this. **ALMSGIVING** Please try to give as much and as freely as possible to help the poor and those in need. Our Operation Rice Bowl and Alms for the Poor Collection offer opportunities to help those less fortunate. **Will I say "YES LORD"???**

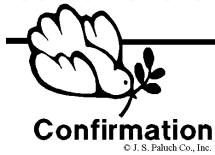
OPERATION RICE BOWL KICK-OFF

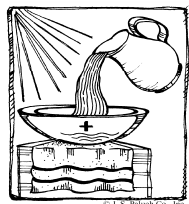

**THERAPY GROUPS
FOR VICTIMS-SURVIVORS
OF SEXUAL ABUSE**

Three twelve-week support groups for men and women who have were sexually abused as minors are being sponsored by the Archdiocese of Chicago's Office of Assistance Ministry. Each group will be led by a licensed professional contracted by the Archdiocese. The professional will have experience working with people in vulnerable situations who want to move forward and take charge of their lives. Participation in the groups is not limited to those who were sexually abused as minors by a priest or deacon. The abuse may have been perpetrated by a family member, friend, or stranger. The groups will meet for twelve consecutive weeks and begin in early March. In order to provide for maximum comfort, two of the groups will be divided on the basis of gender.

DOMINGO VII DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

¿Qué iría a ver toda esa gente que se aglomeró entorno a Jesús? ¿Qué buscaban los escribas que se acercaron a Jesús ese día? ¿En quién tendrían puesta la esperanza aquellos amigos del paralítico que se tomaron la molestia inclusive de quitar el techo para acercarse a su amigo a Jesús? Al parecer Jesús había causado una impresión que no era la que Él quería dar a entender. La gente lo empezaba a buscar más como curandero que como profeta y mensajero de

la salvación. Por eso Jesús hace esta afirmación tan fuerte: “Hijo, tus pecados están perdonados”. Esta era una atribución que sólo Dios se podía dar, y Jesús la realiza con la intención de que quienes lo siguieran se dieran cuenta que la liberación que Él pretendía no era sólo de una enfermedad física, sino sobre todo del pecado que impedía una relación genuina con Dios.

De esta manera vemos como el evangelista Marcos pretende clarificar la misión de Jesús para todos aquellos que habían decidido seguirlo. Seguir a Jesús implica andar el camino de la conversión hacia el Amor de Dios, es decir, ir caminando siempre buscando el camino del perdón, de la aceptación, viviendo la unidad y amando como somos amados por Él. Este camino de conversión tiene que tener signos claros que lo manifiesten. Jesús sanó a aquel paralítico; tal vez nosotros pudiéramos cambiar nuestra actitud, escuchar a quien lo necesita, trabajar con honestidad, darle el tiempo a los más necesitados de nosotros (nuestros hijos, hermanos, padres, etc.)

Muchas veces nosotros nos acercamos a Jesús sólo para que “nos haga” el milagro: el milagro de que pase un examen, el milagro de que consiga trabajo, el milagro de que sane un enfermo, etc. He inclusive nos sentimos muy bien porque acercamos a otros para que le pidan a Dios. Pero, ¿cuántas veces nos dejamos tocar por el Señor? Es decir, ¿cuántas de esas veces estamos dispuestos a cambiar nuestra actitud para perdonar y poder reconciliarme con mi hermano, padre, amigo, o quien fuera; dispuestos a hacer a un lado las actitudes que me alejan de la vida que yo le pido a Dios tener; dispuestos a dejarnos sanar nuestro interior y no sólo nuestro exterior?

Recordemos que Dios no es un “solucionador” de problemas. Dios es una persona, que con su amor e infinita misericordia quiere darle sentido a nuestras vidas. Él está para acompañarnos y guiarnos a través de los problemas que la vida nos va suscitando. Por eso es más importante nuestra conversión interior que nos llevará hacia el Reino definitivo de Dios que la solución de algún problema que tal vez nos aleje más del Señor.
