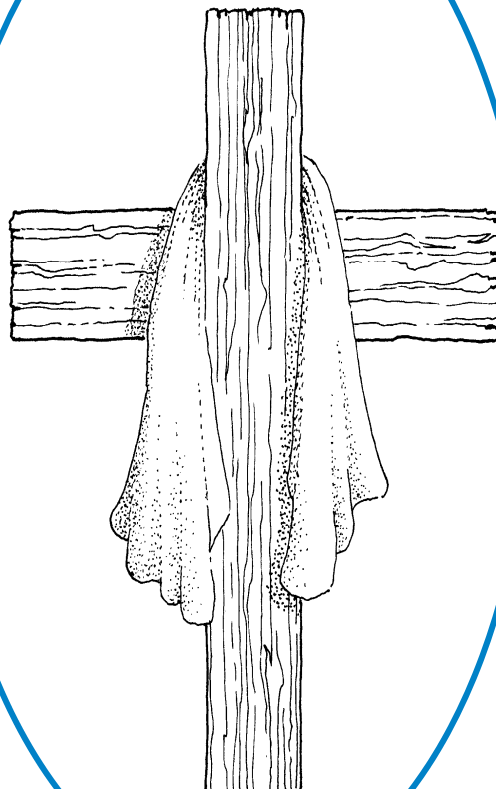
**MISSION STATEMENT**

## PARISH LENTEN COMMUNAL RECONCILIATION

Please spread the word to your family, friends and neighbors that our parish will celebrate Lenten Communal Reconciliation Service on **Tuesday, March 31st at 7:00 p.m.** It will be for all the parishioners both English and Spanish.

In keeping with the practice of the Catholic Church teachings and of the Archdiocese, we will NOT be able to administer General Absolution. What we will do, however, is have a wonderful, spiritual service that will help everyone who participates to grow closer to God.

After gathering, the congregation will be guided through a very thorough Examination of Conscience. This will be done after the Scripture Reading.

Then everyone will pause for few moments and will be requested to articulate their sins (privately and in silence). After the penitents have finished reflecting of their sins, all will kneel and the congregation will recite the Act of Contrition.

Then the individual penitents will walk to one of the priests-confessors. Before you go to the priest-confessor, please put one or two grains of incense in the incense-burner placed in front of the Altar, symbolizing one of the great truths of our salvation history, namely that Jesus, the Christ, died and rose for the forgiveness of sins, and then continue on to the priest-confessor. The priest-confessor will lay his hands on your head and pray as you ask for the Church's absolution. (There will be 4 or 5 priest-confessors available for your convenience at this service).

After the absolution the penitents will return to their place and wait until everyone is finished confessing. When all are finished, the Communal Penance will be recited. The final blessing and dismissal will follow.

*If the person is heavily burdened by a sin or it has been a very long time since the person's last confession or for any other special reason, that person will be encouraged to talk to one of the priest-confessors after the service or at another time for spiritual counseling. The encouragement will be given generally to the entire congregation. It is up to the individual to take advantage of the opportunity to talk to one of the priest-confessors.*

**Please note: Parish Lenten Communal Reconciliation is NOT GENERAL ABSOLUTION.**

I encourage all of you to avail this opportunity for many reasons. Let's celebrate Triduum (that is Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday) the important and most solemn days of our faith with a clean heart and mind. We need not celebrate Easter with guilt in our heart. We need not celebrate Easter without joy, peace and reconciliation. Let's celebrate Easter fully participating in our salvation history, renewing our own baptismal vows, uniting our life to the Risen Life of Christ and uniting ourselves with one another. Filled with God's grace in the sacrament of Reconciliation, recognizing the Living Christ in the Eucharist our union with Him, we will enjoy the New Life in our family, in our community and in our parish. Hope to see all of you at the Communal Reconciliation Service. Please bring a friend or neighbor with you.

### Fourth Sunday of Lent

#### “FOR GOD SO LOVED THE WORLD”

Today's Gospel contains the best known and most often quoted passage in the New Testament. Who has not seen *John 3:16* at a televised sporting event? Who has not heard and read the familiar and comforting words?

“For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life.” Like an old song or a soft blanket, the words comfort us.

#### THE REST OF THE STORY

But the rest of the Gospel verses are not so familiar—or so comforting: “Whoever does not believe has already been condemned” (John 3:18). Do my doubts condemn me? Just how strong is my faith? “People preferred darkness to light because their works were evil” (John 3:19). Can I justify my lifestyle when the world's children are starving? “For everyone who does wicked things hates the light” (John 3:20). What have I done that I don't want others to know about? Why do I look the other way when people or governments act unethically or immorally?

The image of Moses holding up the bronze serpent is a stark reminder of the purpose of the Crucifixion. The Son of Man will be “lifted up”—but first he will suffer a painful death on the cross. We are saved through his suffering love—if we will let him love us. “Whoever lives the truth comes to the light” (John 3:21). To “live the truth” is to accept ourselves as we are—good, bad, and ugly. Love can only enter when our defenses are down. Jesus does not condemn; we condemn ourselves by our non-belief in our own essential goodness. It's an internal condemnation removed only by his gift—the gift of love. Jesus is love. We are saved by love. We save others through love. Love is the only thing worth living—or dying—for.

### **DOMINGO IV DE CUARESMA**

Estamos ya en el cuarto domingo de cuaresma, sólo dos semanas nos faltan para comenzar la Semana Santa y las lecturas de este domingo nos presentan el motivo principal de todo este acontecimiento: El amor de Dios por su pueblo. Como nos lo dice la primera lectura, Dios jamás abandona a su pueblo, Él siempre cumple con su promesa; y san Pablo lo vuelve a recordar: “la misericordia y el amor de Dios son muy grandes”. Analicemos el texto del Evangelio.

Este evangelio es una parte del diálogo entre Jesús y Nicodemo. En los versículos anteriores al evangelio de hoy, Jesús le habla a Nicodemo de la vida eterna, la nueva vida del Espíritu; pero Nicodemo cuestiona a Jesús “¿cómo puede ser esto?”. La respuesta que Juan pone en boca de Jesús es impactante. Cuando hace la comparación del Hijo del hombre con la serpiente bronce en el desierto que sirvió a los israelitas para salvarse de las picaduras de las serpientes, Jesús está pidiendo que para vivir la nueva vida del Espíritu hay que creer en el crucificado como verdadero Hijo de Dios.

Juan le está pidiendo a su comunidad que contemplen al Crucificado y reconozcan en él al Hijo de Dios entregado por su Padre. Es la cruz principio de nuestra salvación. En ella Juan nos pide reconocer el amor que Dios nos ha tenido, su misericordia y la vida que a través de ella nos ha dado. Creer así en el Hijo de Dios, significa entrar en relación con “el Crucificado”. No es un asentimiento de la razón solamente, creer en él significa dejarnos afectar por su amor. Por lo tanto, quien no crea, es decir, quien no quiera tener una relación con Jesucristo Muerto y Resucitado, no podrá vivir la nueva vida del Espíritu.

La oferta de Dios es una realidad evidente, Él nos ha amado de mil maneras a través de los siglos, y muchas han sido sus manifestaciones. Dios jamás abandonará a un hijo suyo, jamás dejará a alguien sin el abrigo de su amor, jamás negará un perdón. Es más, tanto ha amado Dios a su pueblo que su mismo Hijo ha venido a proclamarnos su amor y su misericordia. Sin embargo, esta oferta divina tiene una limitante, nuestra fe. Es decir, si nosotros los hombres no aceptamos tal amor, si no estamos dispuestos a vivir según la vida que Jesús nos enseñó, si no aceptamos relacionarnos con un Crucificado; todo su amor y su esfuerzo por conducirnos a la verdadera vida quedan truncados.

¿No sé por qué los hombres de hoy tienen tanto miedo a creer en Dios? Temen perder su libertad, cuando el amor de Dios los haría plenamente libres; temen perder su razón, cuando Dios es la fuente de toda Verdad; temen comprometerse, cuando Dios les ha dado todo lo que tienen. En fin, creo yo que quien está bautizado y no se decide a vivir su fe, es porque no se ha dado cuenta que Dios lo ha salvado y llenado de su amor. Creer en Jesús es una relación de amor y no sólo unas verdades que memorizar o unos misterios que aceptar.

Esta semana vale la pena renovar nuestra relación con Dios. Trata de hacer un “inventario” de todos los dones, que Dios te ha dado: la vida, la familia, el amor, las amistades, la fe, el gozo, la paz, etc. Y analiza tu respuesta, ¿cómo has respondido a todo esto que Dios te ha regalado? Tal vez sería bueno acercarnos a Dios esta semana para darle gracias y pedirle perdón de nuestras ingratitudes y nuestras faltas hacia nuestros hermanos.

Para tu reflexión personal: Imagina al mundo de hoy como si fuera un paciente en el consultorio de un doctor. ¿Qué diría el doctor que está pasando con la salud del mundo? Haz una lista de los problemas que Jesús puede señalar y nombra algunas de las formas en que los seguidores de Jesús pueden ser sanadores en nuestro mundo.

¿Cómo los miembros de tu familia, comunidad escolar y parroquial muestran que viven en la luz? ¿Qué podemos hacer para ayudar a otros a escoger vivir verdaderamente en la luz?
