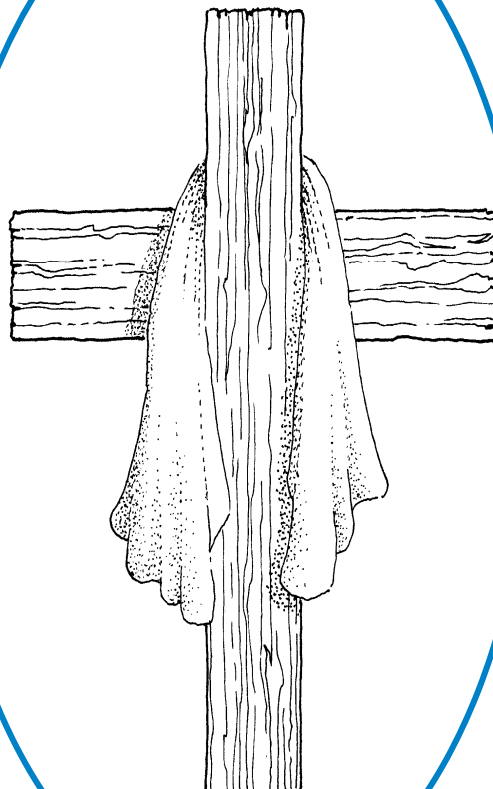
Sacred Heart Parish is a family of believers rooted in the teachings of Jesus Christ.

CONFESSIONS: Saturdays 4:00 to 5:00pm
EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION: The first Thursday of each month from 1:00 to 7:00pm, with Benediction at 7:00pm.
BAPTISMS: Sunday Afternoon at 2:30pm on the First & Fourth Sunday of each month. Arrangements should be made by both parents in advance at the rectory with one of the priests. Both parents and sponsors must attend a meeting on the Third Monday at 7:00pm in the Rectory. Sponsors must be practicing Catholics.
MARRIAGES: Arrangements should be made at least four months in advance to assure time for the banns and the procurements of the necessary documents. It is the wish of the Church that all marriages be solemnized at a Nuptial Mass.
FUNERALS: All arrangements should be made at the rectory by a member of the immediate family. The family is encouraged to receive Holy Communion at the Funeral Mass.
SICK CALLS: Holy Communion will be brought to the sick upon request. In the case of any probable danger of death, call the priest immediately.
NEW PARISHIONERS: We welcome you to Melrose Park and particularly to the Family of Sacred Heart Parish. We ask that you register at your earliest convenience at the rectory.

NOT FOR MY SAKE . . .

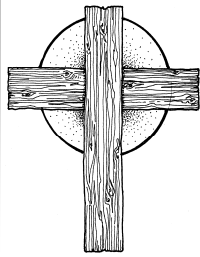
We struggle with the meaning of losing our life in order to find it, of dying in order to live. In the covenant of our world, these contradictory concepts make no sense. But Jesus came to establish a new covenant, one of service and of love. "He learned obedience from what he suffered" (Hebrews 5:8). "Obedience" and "suffering" are two much-misunderstood concepts. To obey means to listen and take to heart. Jeremiah speaks of God's law being written in our hearts, and that we will come to know our God. Psalm 51 cries out to God for "a clean heart," for it is with a clear conscience and clear vision that we will see God's will for us.

BUT FOR YOURS

Just as the prophets and the psalms proclaimed the true way to know and follow God, Jesus shows us in his teaching and in his life how we are to love and serve God and each other. The letter to the Hebrews speaks of Jesus' reverence for God that manifested itself in obedience and suffering, not for its own sake, but for ours and for the glory of God. This mutual love of God and humanity is made perfect in Jesus, and we begin to see how our suffering can serve others and give glory to God. Our work and our prayer are to be for the good of all, not just for our own benefit: "I will draw everyone to myself" (John 12:32). Jesus' goodness and his sacrifice attract us to him and show us the enormity of his love and care for us. He held nothing back that could help us find God.

"Where I am, there also will my servant be" (John 12:26). We look to Jesus for our help in loving God and each other, in giving glory to God and service to others. Our glory and honor lie in serving God and our neighbor with love and reverence.

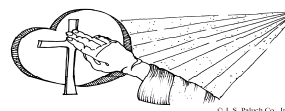

PARISH LENTEN COMMUNAL RECONCILIATION

Please spread the word to your family, friends and neighbors that our parish will celebrate Lenten Communal Reconciliation Service on this week, **Tuesday, March 31st at 7:00 p.m.** It will be for all the parishioners both English and Spanish.

In keeping with the practice of the Catholic Church teachings and of the Archdiocese, we will NOT be able to administer General Absolution. What we will do, however, is have a wonderful, spiritual service that will help everyone who participates to grow closer to God.

After gathering, the congregation will be guided through a very thorough Examination of Conscience. This will be done after the Scripture Reading.

Then everyone will pause for few moments and will be requested to articulate their sins (privately and in silence). After the penitents have finished reflecting of their sins, all will kneel and the congregation will recite the Act of Contrition.

Then the individual penitents will walk to one of the priests-confessors. Before you go to the priest-confessor, please put one or two grains of incense in the incense-burner placed in front of the Altar, symbolizing one of the great truths of our salvation history, namely that Jesus, the Christ, died and rose for the forgiveness of sins, and then continue on to the priest-confessor. The priest-confessor will lay his hands on your head and pray as you ask for the Church's absolution. (There will be 4 or 5 priest-confessors available for your convenience at this service).

After the absolution the penitents will return to their place and wait until everyone is finished confessing. When all are finished, the Communal Penance will be recited. The final blessing and dismissal will follow.

If the person is heavily burdened by a sin or it has been a very long time since the person's last confession or for any other special reason, that person will be encouraged to talk to one of the priest-confessors after the service or at another time for spiritual counseling. The encouragement will be given generally to the entire congregation. It is up to the individual to take advantage of the opportunity to talk to one of the priest-confessors.

Please note: Parish Lenten Communal Reconciliation is NOT GENERAL ABSOLUTION.

I encourage all of you to avail this opportunity for many reasons. Let's celebrate Triduum (that is Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday) the important and most solemn days of our faith with a clean heart and mind. We need not celebrate Easter with guilt in our heart. We need not celebrate Easter without joy, peace and reconciliation. Let's celebrate Easter fully participating in our salvation history, renewing our own baptismal vows, uniting our life to the Risen Life of Christ and uniting ourselves with one another. Filled with God's grace in the sacrament of Reconciliation, recognizing the Living Christ in the Eucharist our union with Him, we will enjoy the New Life in our family, in our community and in our parish. Hope to see all of you at the Communal Reconciliation Service. Please bring a friend or neighbor with you.

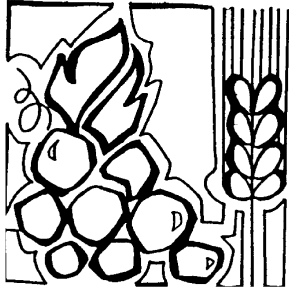

ALIANZA



DOMINGO V DE CUARESMA

Estamos ya en el quinto domingo de Cuaresma y nos preparamos para vivir intensamente la Semana Santa. Escuchamos en las lecturas de hoy una clara referencia por parte de Jesús a lo que sucederá en los próximos días, su oblación absoluta al proyecto del Padre, la Pasión, Muerte y Resurrección de Jesús.

El texto podemos dividirlo en tres partes: una introducción, dónde unos griegos (prosélitos) buscaban dialogar con Jesús; después el contenido central del mensaje, donde Jesús anuncia su entrega definitiva; y una conclusión que parece ser la respuesta de Dios Padre a la decisión de Jesús de continuar su camino hasta la muerte. Analicemos el contenido central del Evangelio.

Jesús nos muestra en estas palabras su conciencia de lo que le espera en los próximos días. Él ha visto cómo su mensaje no ha sido bien recibido por los dirigentes del pueblo judío y sabe que le sucederá si continúa con el anuncio del Reino de Dios. Por eso, estas palabras sobre el grano de trigo reflejan una clara alusión a su vida. Jesús está completa-

mente convencido de que el mensaje que Él ha predicado no es suyo, sino de su Padre; Él está cumpliendo con el llamado que Dios le ha hecho de ir e instaurar su Reino entre los hombres. Por eso, Jesús tiene miedo, porque sabe que no está dispuesto a traicionar la misión que Dios le ha encomendado y por otro lado se da cuenta que el cumplimiento de esta misión le puede ocasionar su muerte.

¡Qué increíble revelación tenemos en este Evangelio! Jesús, nos deja ver su lado humano de manera clara. Jesús tiene miedo. ¿A qué le tiene miedo Jesús? Miedo al sufrimiento, miedo a la muerte, miedo a saberse rechazado por todos los que le decían seguidores de Él, miedo tal vez a que toda su vida fuera a ser inútil si los hombres no acogían su mensaje. Es muy iluminador que Jesús no niegue esta experiencia, pues nos permite sentir cercano a Jesús, nos permite con claridad contemplar su humanidad. Sin embargo, Jesús no se deja inmovilizar por este miedo, Él decide con entereza y madurez aceptar las consecuencias de su misión, pues está convencido que para vivir en plenitud debe buscar responder el llamado que su Padre le ha hecho.

Por último, vendría la respuesta de Dios Padre: “Lo he glorificado y volveré a glorificarlo”. Estas palabras están íntimamente relacionadas con la Resurrección, pues es la glorificación del Hijo realizada por el Padre como respuesta a su oblación (entrega) total.

Contemplar cómo Jesús enfrentó su vocación y decidió cumplir con ella a pesar de las amenazas que esto implicaba, nos fortalece y nos ilumina en nuestra propia respuesta a Dios Padre.

Todos nosotros estamos llamados por Dios; llamados a vivir el amor por encima de la egoísmo, vivir el perdón por encima del odio, la justicia por encima de la injusticia, la verdad por encima de la mentira, la solidaridad por encima de la insensibilidad, la felicidad por encima del placer pasajero, LA PAZ POR ENCIMA DE LA GUERRA. Además, cada uno de nosotros estamos llamados también a vivir todo esto de una manera específica, como matrimonio, como hijos, como padres, como sacerdotes, como consagrados, como misioneros, etc. Sin embargo, muchas veces nos da MIEDO al pensar en las consecuencias que implicaría responderle al Señor; en lugar de enfrentar el miedo, lo evadimos y respondemos a medias, o cuando nos conviene, o negociamos con Dios que sí y que no queremos hacer.

¡Aprendamos de Jesús a saber asumir nuestra responsabilidad... toda ella! Aprendamos a saber morir a nuestros placeres y egoísmos para asumir en nuestras vidas la vida que Dios nos ha dado. Recordemos que si el grano de trigo no muere, no podrá dar frutos.

Esta semana, esfuéstrate por cumplir aquel propósito de Cuaresma que no has podido cumplir; o piensa en alguien que no has querido perdonar, amar o servir por cualquier motivo y hazlo esta semana. Atrevámonos a morir a nuestro pecado para poder resucitar plenamente con nuestro Señor en la Pascua.
