**We** offer our time, talents and treasure as stewards of God's Church. **We** call on each other's support as we build God's Kingdom.

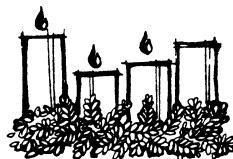

**CONFESSIONS:** Saturdays 4:00 to 5:00pm

**EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION:** The first Thursday of each month from 1:00 to 7:00pm, with Benediction at 7:00pm.

**BAPTISMS:** Sunday Afternoon at 2:30pm on the First & Fourth Sunday of each month. Arrangements should be made by both parents in advance at the rectory with one of the priests. ## Tercer Domingo de Adviento

### “TU DIOS ESTÁ EN MEDIO DE TI”

La lectura de hoy de Sofonías y el salmo responsorial resaltan que “tu Dios está en medio de ti”. Tanto la una como el otro proclaman la presencia de Dios en el pueblo de Israel y predicen nuestra fe en la Encarnación. Dios no está lejos. Al prepararnos para la llegada de la Navidad es oportuno preguntarnos cuál es la voluntad de Dios para nosotros, a quién estamos llamados a perdonar, y de qué manera somos tentados. ¿Qué debemos hacer para que el reino de Dios venga a nuestra vida de una manera más plena en esta Navidad?
